The US Conference of Catholic Bishops' 2002 document, *A Place at the Table*, reminds us that the poor often lack a place at the dinner table as well as at the decision making tables of community, business & government. That same table image can be used to illustrate the essential roles of all of us in walking with low-income people in their struggle to both work and care for their children. New York legislators face tough decisions as they work to balance the budget. Next week our parish will participate in Diocesan Public Policy Weekend. We will be asked to advocate to our legislators on behalf of working families who are struggling to survive. Petitions will be available that read:
