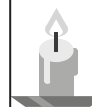

Questions regarding the new Roman Missal:

Question: Will the translations in the new Roman Missal be permanent?

Answer: While we can confidently say that this translation will be used for years to come, we must avoid calling it "permanent." Truly, this one English version of the prayers will be used in all Masses offered in English – replacing the previous version. However, that does not mean that the work of translating is ever complete or permanent. Just as forty years ago we received the first English translation and we receive another today, so in the future (perhaps in another 40 years or more...), new translations or edited translations, will likely be proposed and implemented.

St. Mary's and St. Matthew Youth ministry groups will be attending the National Catholic Youth Conference in Indianapolis on November 16th-20th. To help them along their pilgrimage they are making prayer buttons that will be available for a donation. These buttons will have the name and picture of a teen attending the conference. During the weekend of November 12-13 DONOR LIFE REGISTRY CARDS will be available at a table in the narthex. People who complete the card will become part of the consent registry in New York State. Cards can be completed immediately or brought to church the following weekend. The cards are also designed to be folded and mailed.

To access the CASE Retraining Program, follow these simple steps:

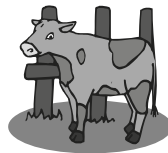
