Questions regarding the new Roman Missal:

Question: Sometimes I see the priest moving his lips, but without hearing him. What is he saying?

Answer: Throughout the Mass but especially when the priest is at the altar, there are some prayers that are said by the priest in "a low voice" or "inaudibly". Such prayers are meant to be spoken by the priest in a quiet voice since these prayers are prayed by him for his own sake – that his offering of self as a priest will be acceptable. Some examples of this would be when the priest is preparing the gifts as he himself prepares to pray the Eucharistic Prayer, and those before Holy Communion. While the people do not hear him, they should be aware of their own prayers on behalf of the priest contribute to these moments. In addition, there are moments, especially during and after Holy Communion, during which the people are encouraged to pray silently for their own needs – just as the priest is able to pray for himself.
